Other Considerations

Authors are responsible for the accuracy of the references. Reference accuracy is critical to allow readers to access the original literature source.

- All author names should be listed.
- References citing personal correspondence or unarchived material obtained from the Web are discouraged. "Anonymous" is not acceptable as an author; if the author is unknown, list the reference by company, agency, organization, or journal source.
- Do not list references as "in press" unless they have been formally accepted for publication—in that case determine whether a DOI has been assigned and include the DOI in the reference instead.
- Use complete sentences when adding a note in the References section.
